In Sept. of 2008 I, along with Jerry Wheeler, another member of Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 79, attended a Corvette show at the Bedford, Mass. VA Hospital. The shows proceeds benefited the patients in the hospital. Jerry asked me if we could have a show like this at our VA in Albany, NY. My response was that we don't have the manpower to do anything like this.

The next year, while attending a local car show, I was approached by two car show promoters. Bill Schroeder and Gerry Linen who had heard about the Bedford show. They asked if my chapter would want to sponsor a show like that in the Albany VA. I contacted John Rataino president of VVA Chapter 8 and he was interested. With the help of Bill and Gerry and Chapters 79 and 8 teaming up we now had the manpower.

Late in 2009 I contacted Peter Potter, the PR man for the hospital, and Karen Covey, the director of Voluntary Services. After receiving permission from the administration, we began having monthly meetings. There was a lot of work to be done, but with the volunteers things started to come together.

The date was set for August 7, 2010. The weather that day turned out sunny and warm. With conditions like that we had over 200 cars in attendance. Volunteers from both chapters, as well as from the hospital, arrived for registration, a silent auction, parking, etc. We had a DJ, Andy Narzynski, playing oldies and giving out door prizes. There were food vendors, antique military vehicles on display, a military honor guard to present the colors, and a VA employee, Scott Truesdell, sang the National Anthem. With all this, the show was a success.

Living in a hospital can be a depressing situation for the veterans. This show allowed many patients to come out for the day and view
